

most iconic houses in the city. Built circa 1710 it was originally only one room thick with a stair tower at the rear. It was added to several times and for a while served as a bank before being divided up into flats in the C20th. The Winchester College don Graham Drew lived there. Meeting by his fire, he encouraged a whole cohort of Wykehamists to be artists, art and architectural historians: many are now amongst the most distinguished practitioners and writers of our time. I had the good fortune to restore it back to one house in the early 2000s. We found a medieval pavement about 1 metre below current ground level in the courtyard at the rear: a reminder both that Winchester's origins as a settlement lie in a place where the Itchen could be forded, and by how much the natural ground level has risen since then. 
